HICC is maturing – we're in our third year now and perioperative and periinterventional haemostasis is continuing to draw special interest. It is becoming more evident with every meeting that this topic is a perfect example for the need of interdisciplinarity. As haemostasis in critical care is an important issue in patients that are undergoing or have been undergoing surgical therapies, the direct and indirect input of surgeons to HICC is indeed "critical". This extends especially to trauma patients as they have a multitude of problems such as direct tissue and bone damage, hypothermia, acidosis, hypovolemia, dilution effects etc. All these problems directly or indirectly interfere with haemostasis, sometimes leading to a vicious cycle that can be hard (and even impossible) to break. Even if we are able to stop the bleeding in a patient with severe trauma using all our bells and whistles, we might not be able to prevent another fatal complication.

Therefore, following our goal to be (also) a forum of interdisciplinarity, the main focus of this years' meeting will be on surgical issues related to HICC, especially on haemostasis in trauma.

We are very happy that world renowned specialists in the field of damage control surgery and trauma haemostasis have accepted to present at this years HICC meeting.

The handling of the perioperative use of antiplatelet therapy is continuously gaining more and more importance – this is why we would like to elaborate a common recommendation together with our colleagues from the GIHP (French – Canadian working group on perioperative haemostasis).

In addition, we will discuss important topics in vascular surgery as well as oncologic surgery as both fields deal with patients at high risk for perioperative complications.

And last but not least, we hope that we will again spend some joyful social time together at our meanwhile "reputated" dinner party ...
